President's Report

Recap of 2021

- Class has a record 78 Members including 74 Owners
- Class events revived and well attended (all had 10+ boats)
 - Cedar Point One Design
 - Block Island Race Week
 - NAC in Chicago
 - Pequot Invitational
 - Continued to see boats performing well in distance races
 - Undertaking an article to discuss rigging options for crewed and double-handed distance racing



2021 J/109 North American Championship

The 2021 NAC provided this year's opportunity to inspect boats for compliance with the Class Rules. Inspection of 10 competing boats was done July 27 & 28 at the host Columbia YC, except one boat that refused to move from nearby Chicago YC.

- This was the culmination of more than six months of prep work. From January through June, the following took place:
 - a half dozen meetings online where the Class requirements were explained and plans to get competitors to comply was discussed in detail.
 - Numerous reminder emails with links to Class rules, the measurement checklist, crew declaration/classification, and sail registration/declaration were sent to the Organizers, competitors, and sail makers by myself, Bill Kneller and John Greifzu.
 - Several one-on-one phone calls and emails with certain competitors.
- **Unfortunately, too much was left to the last minute.** Most boats did not comply with the Class requirements as late as the day of boat inspection (e.g., sail tags, required equipment, crew classification).
- Considering this somewhat rocky start, the inspection of boats went relatively smoothly and most owners cooperated in the process.

Several irregularities were noted requiring Class Measurerer and the Class Technical Committee (TC) to make several compromises to clear boats in time for competition.

- 1. The two French built boats had Lithium-Ion batteries installed. The size was similar to the approved lead technology batteries and therefore approved for this event.
- One of the French built boats did not have any handrails installed on the cabin top. The compromise was to lash 5 pound weights on top of the cabin top port & starboard. Unfortunately, pictures from the event reveal that the boat moved the weights to the base of the shrouds without Measurer or TC approval.





- 3. One US built boat had custom made shorter handrails.
- 4. Several boats had two jib cars on each track. The compromise was to uncouple the two cars and latch the second car to the back end of the track.
- One US built boat had new holes drilled in all stanchions in order to lower the lower lifelines. The lower lifelines were moved up to factory height for racing. All but one boat had the lifelines set too loose.

- 6. Several boats had secondary cleats installed for several different functions. The compromise was to tape one set closed.
- 7. Most boats had bob stays connected at the time of inspection, which had to be disabled. Incidentally, boats with bobstays restricted the pole from full extension by about 4-6 inches.
- 8. With the bobstays disconnected all sprits were on average 2 inches too long. All sprit extensions were shortened to Class specification of 66 inches at the time of final inspection.
- 9. One boat did not have the salon table installed the measurer did not get an opportunity to reinspect before the end of the inspection time.



10. Four or five boats did not have sail tags attached to the sails. Too many envelopes with sail tags floated around. One boat was missing tags for one sail altogether, this sail was removed from the boat before racing. This is a problem that owners as well as the local sail makers need to own up to.





 A special Thanks to Bill Kneller for the time he spent helping me sort out "tag issues" and other admin issues like crew classification and payments. Without his support from the "home office" it would have been almost impossible to complete inspection in time for the regatta.
